- **Rotary International and administrators at Bahçeşehir University in Istanbul, Turkey, are now recruiting fellowship candidates for a new peace centre opening at the university.**

The Otto and Fran Walter Rotary Peace Centre will offer experienced peace-builders based in the Middle East and North Africa the opportunity to complete a one-year professional development certificate program, earning postgraduate diplomas in peace and development studies. You can read about Otto and Fran Walter. This brings the number of Rotary Peace Centres to 7.

Seven Areas of Focus

- Peacebuilding and conflict prevention
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water, sanitation and hygiene
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Community economic development
- Supporting the environment



Global Grants – Their Impact

- West Bengal, India – D3240 – Clean Water & Washing hands – 2,500 helped - cost - \$70K
- Durgapur City – D3240 – Toilet Blocks/Sanitation – 1,000 helped – cost \$50K
- Durgapur City – D3240 – Covid Protection – 2,500 helped – Cost \$30K
- North Lebanon – Water Filtration – 1,000 schools – 600,000 children – clean water
- Nigeria – D9110, 9125, 9141, 9142 - ‘Together for Healthy Families’ – Maternal Health - \$2 Million - Program of scale
- Guatemala – Literacy project – 23 years – 48 grants - \$6.5 million – 800 clubs in 90 districts.
- Zambia – Fighting Malaria – 7 districts – trained 2,500 health workers serving 1,250,000 patients. Cost \$2 million – another program of scale.

What is a Rotarian?

- A Rotarian is a person:
 - Who digs wells from which they will never drink
 - Who vaccinates children they will never meet
 - Who restores sight for those they will never see
 - Who builds houses they will never live in
 - Who educates children they will never know
 - Who plants trees they will never sit under
- Who feeds hungry people, regardless of race, religion or politics
 - Who makes limbs so people can walk half a world away
- And - Who knows that there is real happiness in serving others

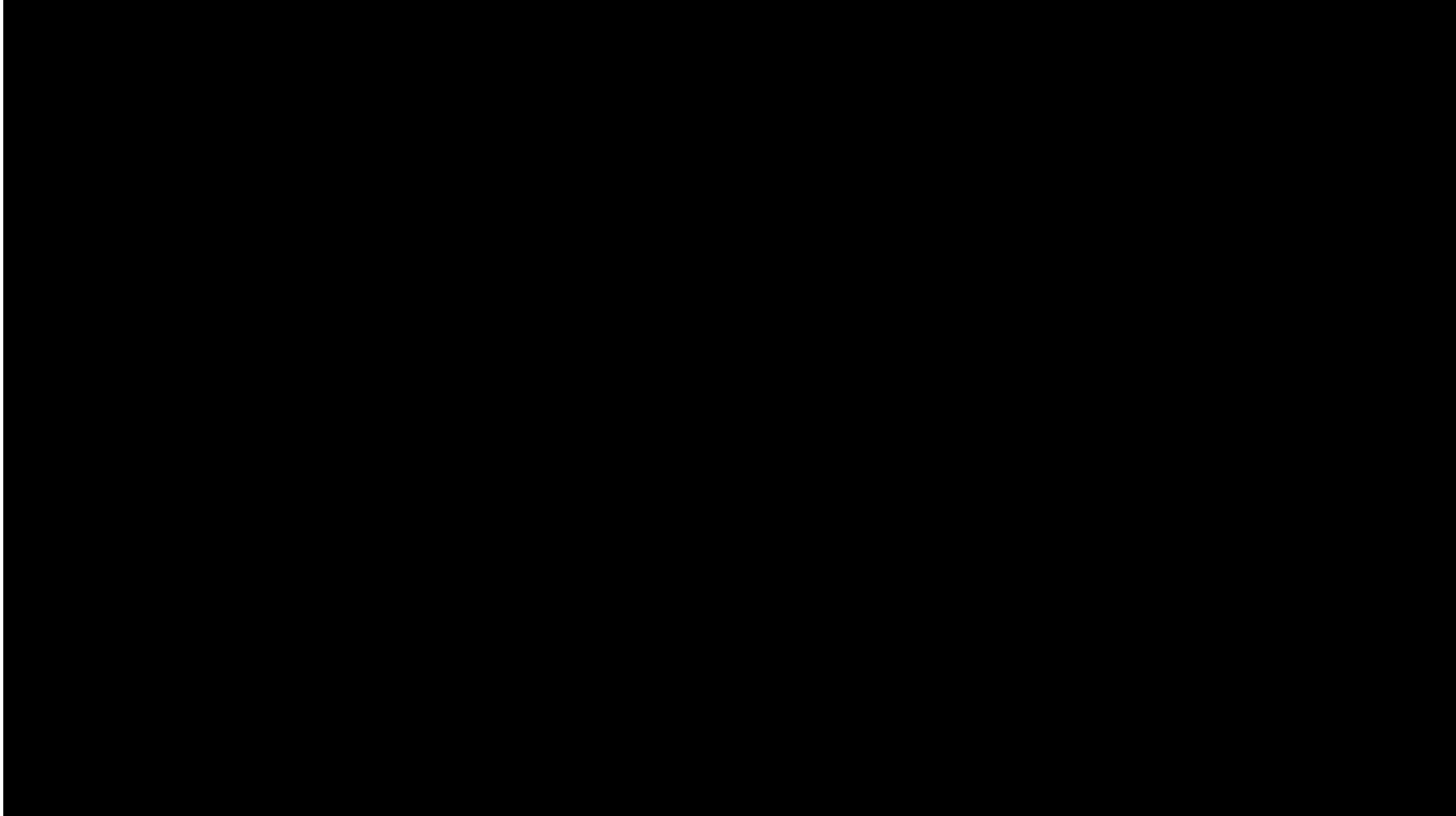
Personal Giving
