
There will be two options for 2024/25



Rotary Youth under Sail

A partnership between Ocean Youth Trust North and Rotary 1040 working together for over 13 years

There are Rotary sponsored places on a 6 day 'Adventure under Sail' aimed at developing

- Self-confidence and resilience
- Interpersonal and social skills
- Ability to work as a team
- Sense of responsibility and respect for others

393 young people from Clubs within the 1040 District have benefitted so far

Compliments rather than conflicts with RYLA – is more about learning how to be being part of a team



Rotary Youth under Sail

As a watch leader and a rotary mentor I learnt a lot about helping young people develop confidence and ability.

Every year I am fascinated watching 12 young people arrive as individuals and leave as part of an effective team who work really well together supporting each other

After returning home our daughter asked to eat dinner with us for the 1st time in a long while and then asked if we could all play cards – she has been isolating herself and this voyage has made a huge difference

The James Cook is quite confined and brings out social interaction and communication skills

A few of the young people come back to volunteer and share their skills with our young people – some have even taken up a career in sail training

We had one very happy & exhausted teenager come back from a voyage who will remember his week sailing on the North Sea forever.

The programme has changed young people's lives... a great outcome to be proud off

One girl we sponsored on the tall ships race went on to have a career in sailing



Our challenge to the world is based on <u>five Earthshots</u> – simple but ambitious and universal goals for 2030 developed in collaboration with leading environmental experts. They are Protect and Restore Nature; Clean our Air; Revive our Oceans; Build a Waste-Free World; and Fix our Climate.







